This Friday we are very fortunate to have Kurt Barnes visit the school for our assembly and discuss with our students his achievements in international golf and his recent win in the Asian Cup.

Attendance exemption: Each week in our newsletter we will be focusing on an issue related to attendance. This week we would like to make parents aware of the need to apply for an exemption from school if you know in advance that your child is going to be absent from school for any longer than 5 days. This could be, for example, for a planned family holiday that cannot be scheduled during school holidays or going interstate/overseas. If you know that your child is going to miss more than 5 school days, you need to come into the office and ask for the paperwork to apply for a school exemption to ensure that these absences do not get counted on your child's yearly record. We appreciate your ongoing assistance in the area of attendance.

**Enrolling now for Kinder in 2012:** If you have a child who is ready to start school in 2012, please collect an information package from the school office. Muswellbrook South Public School can provide an exciting and wonderful K-6 journey for your child.

Learning happens everywhere and all the time for your baby, toddler and preschooler. These early experiences lay the foundation for your child's learning in later years. Learning starts long before school. It starts at birth and keeps happening every day. In fact, your child will learn more in their first 12 months than at any other time of their life. Not because of flashcards or any formal learning, but simply by growing, developing and watching other people and the world around them. These early childhood years lay the foundations for what your child learns once they start school. You have a vital role to play in helping your child learn through these early years. You might think you don't know much about learning and teaching, and you might have had bad experiences at school yourself. But you are your child's first teacher, and your child will keep learning from you as they get older.

### **School Excursion and Representative Sport**

As part of our behaviour code and our schools PBL focus, the school, and the P & C have endorsed a behaviour code for excursions and school excursions. On this sheet that you will receive at home are the expectations of the activities. Each child is required to read, sign and discuss with their parents the expectations of their behaviour when they are away. It also states who can participate in these activities, where a child falls on our card system, warning of suspension and suspension. Also, there is flexibility of this process where as Principal I have the final say about a child's current or past behaviour and whether they attend or not. My final decision will be made after a variety of consultative processes. This process is made up of data, conversations with parents, carers, teachers and our School Education Director. The students who will be attending the Warrumbungles excursion will be receiving this sheet in a few days for signage. Please be aware that if a child misbehaves and breaks this code the parent /carer will be called to pick up their child from the school excursion or school sporting activity.

This format is implemented across the region in many schools.

### This week is Literacy and Numeracy Week and we have provided some tips for reading.

# What parents can do at home to help their kids with reading

- Be confident that your child will learn to read. Give positive messages and involve them in everyday conversations and opportunities to read.
- Read aloud to your child. It helps them to learn about the language of books and will encourage them to enjoy books and reading.
- Read to your child in your home language if your first language is not English.
- Make reading enjoyable and talk about books, magazines and computer stories that you have read together.
- Try not to let television intrude on reading time. Make a special time for reading with your child, away from interruptions.
- Listen to your child read as often as you can, every day if possible, even if only for a short time.
- Give books in print or electronic form as treats and presents.

## Hints for listening to your child read

- When reading together at home try to make the time relaxed, enjoyable and positive. Vary it. Read together, read to your child and take turns or have them read to you.
- Before reading, talk about the cover, the title and the pictures, and discuss what the book may be about.
- During reading, discuss what has been read up to that point and predict what might happen next.
- After you've finished reading with your child, talk and ask questions about the story and the pictures.

### Things to remember about reading

- The goal of reading is always to make sense of what is read.
- Try to be interested, supportive and enjoy the time together.
- Read with your child anywhere and at any time; don't forget that many everyday experiences provide opportunities to put reading and writing into action.
- Visit and use a library near you. Borrow books for yourself as well as for your child.
- Talk to your child's classroom teacher or the principal for further help and advice.

Kangaroos are herbivores which means they are vegetarians.


When kangaroos are born they are 2cm long and they spend the first six months in their mothers' pouch.

### Healthy Dad's Healthy Kids - Comes to Muswellbrook

**Could Dad lose a few kilos?** The Healthy Dad's Healthy Kids program is an award winning weight loss program for dads/stepdads which is funded by Coal and Allied and is coming to Muswellbrook. The program covers the nine best weight loss tips for men, so dad can shed some unwanted kilos (without having to eat like a rabbit). In 2009, dads in Newcastle lost almost 9kg on average by joining the program.

Healthy Dads, Healthy Kids will give dad new ideas for spending active, quality time with the kids and advice on how to get kids eating well without creating a battleground at the dinner table. Healthy Dads, Healthy Kids involves 4 dads-only sessions and 3 dads and kids sessions across twelve weeks. 
