I chose to be a teacher to achieve this purpose and I worked hard to become a principal to broaden my impact beyond the children in my classroom, to the staff at my school and the children in their classrooms. The mistakes of last week have damaged relationships across our school community that are vital for our school to achieve that driving purpose. And that hurts. It makes me angry, disappointed and ashamed that we have failed our students and our parents in such a fundamental way. Please be reassured that we are prepared to sit in that uncomfortable situation until we have made it right. We will do everything within our power to ensure that no other child or parent is faced with that kind of fear again. We will work with the family directly affected and with the broader school community to rebuild trust, and ensure the safety and wellbeing of our students, because we truly care for our students, we want the best for them and we want to ensure that every day, every student is better than they were vesterday.

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In planning for 2020 classes, we ask that any families who won't be returning in 2020 please notify the office as soon as possible.






Attendance Hero

Infants (K-2) ceremony will commence at 9:45am Primary (Grades 3-6) ceremony will commence at approximately 11am.


K-6 class awards will be presented as well as special awards and the induction of the new school leaders for 2020.

Motor skills are movements and actions of the bone structures. Typically, they are broken into two groups: gross motor skills and fine motor skills. Gross motor skills are involved in movement and coordination of the arms, legs, and other large body parts. Fine motor skills are involved in smaller movements that occur in the wrists, hands, fingers, feet and toes. These two motor skills work together to provide coordination. Here are some fun gross motor skills to do with your family!
