Dear Parents and Carers,

Lunchtime activities

What we as a community need to be teaching our children is that there are many ways to solve this conflict and mostly that involves talking and listening to each other. Our teachers spend many hours each day talking through conflict situations with students, situations such as "He took my ball,", "She doesn't want to play with me," "He's not talking it out." These all have the potential to turn into major issues if students are quick to anger and do not listen to each other. If students are having trouble solving minor conflict they must speak to a teacher who will mediate the issue and model how to solve the problem. Please support us by encouraging your child to ignore, tell that person to stop and seek help if needed. Ultimately we want our




