## PRINCIPAL'S message

Attending school regularly is important. Not only because it's the law, but because children who have attendance rates of 90% or above, grow into adults who are healthier, happier and more financially secure. We view students with attendance below 90% to be educationally at risk. The current research tells us that some of the consequences of non-attendance include:

 Poorer long-term mental health and social outcomes

 Increased likelihood of involvement with criminal activity

· Increased likelihood of requiring social assistance.

Currently we have about 300 students with attendance above 90%, which is amazing. There are another 70 with attendance rates of 85%-90%. If these children attend school every day until the end of term, they will join our above 90% group.

I am yet to meet a parent that doesn't want the best for their children. Attending school helps children to be their best. Please impress the importance of school attendance on your children. School teaches children so much more than how to read, write and count. It teaches children how to build friendships. It provides a sense of belonging and connection. It supports children in countless ways, helping them to become productive members of society.

Nonder for school


Muswellbrook South Public School is participating in the Wonder



#### **PYJAMA DAY - THURSDAY 10 JUNE**



## Healthy Lunch Box recipe

<u>Layered mixed potato bake.</u>



#### Ingredients

Olive oil spray 2 large potatoes, peeled & thinly sliced lengthways 1 large sweet potato, peeled & thinly sliced lengthways 2 zucchinis, thinly sliced lengthways ½ cup frozen corn kernels ½ cup frozen peas 8 eggs, lightly beaten ½ cup reduced-fat milk ½ cup reduced-fat Ricotta ½ cup reduced-fat tasty cheese, grated 1 tsp fresh thyme, leaves picked

#### Method

Preheat oven to 180°c. Line and spray a 20cm square cake tin with olive oil.

Steam the sweet potato and potato until just tender. In the base of the cake tin, layer half of the sweet potato followed by half of the potato, then ¼ cup frozen peas and ¼ cup frozen corn. Top with a layer of half the zucchini. Repeat.

Mix the eggs, milk, ricotta and ¼ cup of the cheese in c jug. Pour over the vegetables. Top with remaining grated cheese and the thyme.

Bake for 25-30 minutes or until golden and set. Cool fc 5 minutes before serving.
